## **VALE LUKE FITZGERALD**

It's been a very difficult week here as we mourn the loss of a great friend and champion wool man who lost his brief battle with cancer on Monday this week. Luke was only diagnosed in mid January and unfortunately it was too late to treat which gave little time for family and close friends to prepare for the worst.

Luke was highly regarded by both growers and buyers and the tributes and condolences sent this week are a mark of the affection and esteem he was held in by many. He was genuinely one of those people who did not have an enemy in the world. Luke and I started working together in 1985 at Starlotters in Yennora which was his first job out of school. He worked in the wool industry for all but 2 years of his working life and has spent almost 30 years working with me in our business. He spent a few years as a wool buyer in the late 80's with French firm VanLaine and had a wide circle of close friends in the buying trade still today. It is an enormous mark of respect for him of the many messages and phone calls I have received this week from the buying trade, some who retired many years ago but still kept in touch and respected him so much. A minute's silence was held in the sale room on Tuesday and in a rare turn of events yesterday the National Auction Committee ruled that the following week's wool sale would be moved back a day to allow buyers time to value as most will be in Dubbo next Friday. Previous attempts by Brokers to shift sale days has always been met with resistance. This is a great example of the love and respect the wool trade had for him. His role here as client wool advisor, wool valuer and auctioneer and technical manager, not to mention social manager will be sorely missed and big shoes to fill.

Our heartfelt wishes and condolences go to his wife Christine, Nicola and William. The service will be in Dubbo next Friday, 24<sup>th</sup> February at 11am St. Brigid's Catholic Church, 198 Brisbane Street, Dubbo followed by a send off most likely at the Western Star Hotel, 62 Erskine Street, Dubbo. Details will be confirmed soon.

The wool market this week bowed under the pressure of quantity as the largest offering in 3 years of 57,196 bales came forward. Not surprisingly the passed in rate nationally of 16% was considerably higher than last week with WA holding on to 27% of the offering. Next week will see a similar sized offering making it the largest consecutive fortnight total in almost 12 years. It will be difficult to predict a stronger market although the underlying sentiment seems to be positive.
